Product Description:

Control Center is the Carbyne back-office administration platform intended to be used with Universe and APEX. It enables the administrator to make configuration changes, track activities and manage contacts, users, and groups displayed on the platform. It also provides access to Events History and critical system logs.

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Notes:

This report was created upon completion of accessibility evaluation performed during March 2023.

The report is considered accurate at the time of publishing.

Evaluation Methods Used:

A combination of automated and manual testing techniques was employed for the accessibility assessment.

- Manual assessment was performed using Chrome/NVDA on Windows 10 and extensive use of keyboard.
- Automated tools used included the Deque aXe browser extension & Deque aXe Auditor.
